How to Apply

A student seeking temporary permission to practise in an Early Learning and Care setting during the period up to 1st of September 2024 should complete this Student Fast-Track Application Form for Temporary Permission to Practise and have it signed and stamped by their Institution/Department/School.

The student should then email a scanned copy of the signed and stamped form to the Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth at eyqualifications@equality.gov.ie, along with their contact details (name, address and email address), where it will be assessed. If approved, a Letter of Temporary Permission to Practise will be issued to the student.

Please note:

The standard application process remains in place for individuals – including students – to obtain a general (not time-limited) Letter of Eligibility to Practise, on the basis of equivalence of their qualification profile with a major award in Early Childhood Care and Education at level 5 on the National Framework of Qualifications. It is possible to submit both a fast-track application and a standard application at the same time. It remains the case that any student who already has a full level 5 award or a Letter of Eligibility to Practise from DCEDIY is already qualified to be employed to work directly with children in an ELC service, and does not need to complete any additional application for permission to practise.
